

Welcome

We are delighted that you have decided to join our choir!

Here are a few things you will need to know, so that your Three Rivers experience is as enjoyable as possible:



Music and Folders

- We hand out the music pieces that we are going to learn, generally at the start of the term or after a concert, when we start to learn a new repertoire.
- You will be given a **music folder** with our current music which is yours to use throughout your choir membership. If you decide to no longer continue with the choir (and we hope you don't!), please return your folder to us with any music you have, as the folders and music are a considerable expense for the choir, and we need to reuse both the folders and the music.
- You are encouraged to make notes on your music, as directed by Sue, our Music Director, but we would ask that you **only use pencil** and you write lightly on your copy, so that it can be rubbed out. We are sometimes asked to loan music to other groups, so any notes would need to be removed. Please **DO NOT USE PEN** on your music!
- We sing a **broad range of music** - choral pieces, traditional folk and pieces from other countries, pieces from musicals, carols (in season) and also some more modern, popular music such as A Million Dreams from The Greatest Showman. We welcome suggestions from the choir for pieces that you'd like to sing, so please let us know if there are pieces you would enjoy. We generally sing short pieces, not long choral works.

Fees

- Now that you have joined, there is a weekly fee of £4 per session, which is payable termly in advance by cheque, cash or BACS). Our bank details for those paying by BACS are:

- We would ask that you pay your termly fee just before the start of term or within the first week of the term please, as this helps us with our cashflow. We are a 'not for profit' organisation, so all funds are needed to keep the choir operational.

Rehearsals & Performances

- We meet every **Thursday** during term time from **7.30pm to 9.15pm** at **Winchcombe School**, Maple Crescent, Newbury, RG14 1LN in the main hall. There is plenty of parking and good access into the school hall.
- We perform in 1-2 **concerts** throughout the year, and these are well attended and enjoyable events. However, we know that some people don't like to perform, so attendance at the concerts is optional. We always have a sign-up sheet a few weeks beforehand just to get an indication of numbers. Dress code at the concerts is usually black clothing with an accent colour that varies according to the occasion and season.
- In addition to these larger concert events, we also perform in the community from time to time or at other events and again, these are optional for those who wish to take part.
